Every Sunday at both morning and evening services we would attend and Max was the organist, so you would always see him at the organ and playing those great hymns which you never hear now. Max was a quiet person but friendly and very polite. I recall Max being pretty athletic also. At the annual church picnics there were always games and events for everyone. I remember being impressed by Max outrunning all the other men in the sprint event. He was a close friend of my parents and my understanding is that Dad had something to do with Max moving up to Papua New Guinea where we had moved to in 1965. Max worked with the wonderful Rose family at Nondugl and we enjoyed seeing him when we visited the incredible wild life sanctuary there. We were also near the Nazarene Mission at Kudjip, a truly amazing group of people and which is where Max met his wife Miriam who was a nurse there. I lost contact with Max when I moved to California in 1979 and it was only by "coincidental" connections with Gabriele Rose and Barbara Carpenter that we got connected in September of 2019. So it has been a brief but very special period to be exchanging letters and texts with Max. Covid prevented a visit but we will make up for that one day. To the family and friends who have been close to Max all these years, my condolences for having the fellowship cut for now. I am sure he has been having fabulous reunions in heaven though. 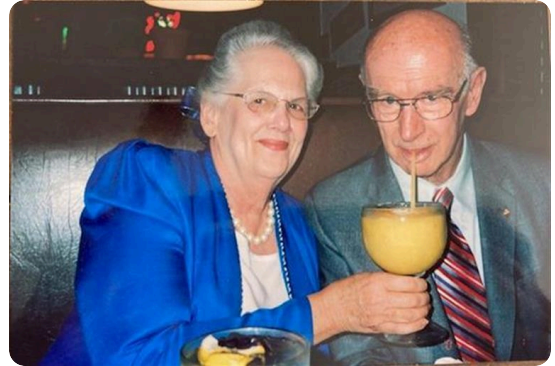
