As a child survivor of the Holocaust whose parents survived internment at Bergen-Belsen concentration camp, Susie dedicated her life to a profound purpose- as a Jewish educator and Hebrew teacher, she sought to honor her parents by ensuring future generations were deeply immersed in Jewish culture. This commitment was exemplified through every Bar/Bat Mitzvah and adult student she taught over her sixty-year career.


She also made substantial global contributions as an editor and publisher of transformative works intended to provide individuals with the resources to cultivate more harmonious and purposeful lives. A name synonymous with love and purpose, Susie was understanding by nature and lived authentically, an intelligent woman whose kindness was felt by all.

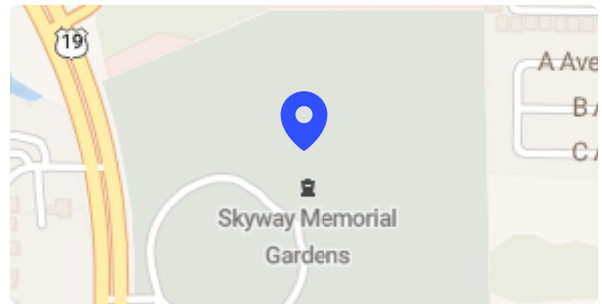

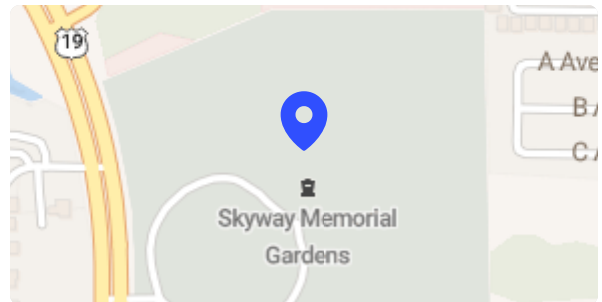
