We remember Kristopher fondly for his kindness and humor and we're happy to have had this chance to have met him. We're sad that we'll never be able to see him again. “ There isn't a day that goes by that Brandon, nor I, haven't thought about you. Driving to base makes me think of you, since it was the way you took to work. Going past Bobe's Bar & Grill makes me remember all of the times you would message me on Thursday nights and tell me about stripper night, and I would tell you 'smh' every single time. Tice helped me through many hard months, many hard months that I didn't feel like I knew where my life was going or months that I felt like I was crumbling down. More than anyone, Tice knew exactly what to say, no bullshit and just the straight hard truth. He also understood, sometimes people just want to sit in a dark room alone and listen to music and they are completely fine, there was no asking "are you okay?" a thousand times, he just understood. I think about my relationship with Tice, and I read and listen to everyone's stories, and I see that he touched us all in his own Tice way. Each of us had a different relationship with him, each of us knew a different Tice depending on who we were and our personalities. I knew Tice as someone who always checked up on me, who tried to drag my non-social self out of the house, and someone he could talk to about women (and his one thousand questions about them). But other people knew him as the music Tice, or the racing Tice, or the bar Tice. There are so many moments I take for granted with him, and I wish so badly that I could go back and say yes to all of those times he asked me to come out to the bar with him or to come over and chill. I won't ever forget him, as he has permanently made an impact on mine, and my husband's lives. He is alive in our heart's everyday, and I hope his family finds some peace with all of the love and kindness, as well as plenty of laughs, he brought to so many people.
