Magdi Boutros 68, of Palmetto, FL passed away on April 21, 2021. Magdi was born July 20, 1952 in Alexandria, Egypt. He moved to the United States in the late 70's, becoming an American citizen in 1986. Magdi was educated in Egypt and Lebanon, was fluent in English, French and Arabic. He loved to travel. In 1981 Magdi married Pauline Stepnowski; they resided in Pembroke Pines, FL. until 2015. Magdi's jobs included travel agent at Hollywood Travel in Hollywood, FL and later, Manager of Aventura Travel in Aventura, FL. Eventually, he opened his own travel agency in Aventura called TPI, Travel Professional International. Magdi was very active in the travel community and was a Certified Travel Consultant. He enjoyed traveling with his wife and his extended family, frequently taking FAM trips overseas to Europe. In 1997 Magdi joined American Airlines as a flight attendant. He quickly moved up the ranks where he became a purser. After 15 years, on May 20, 2014, he decided to retire. Looking for a quieter lifestyle, he and his wife moved to Hutchinson Island on the east coast of Florida. In an effort to live closer to his family, they next moved to Terra Ceia Bay in Palmetto, FL. In the Terra Ceia Village, he made friends very quickly.
